Lancaster Archery Academy Target League Shooter Agreement

- **1.1** By signing this agreement, archers acknowledge that they will abide by our Code of Conduct (see Appendix A) and follow all Lancaster Archery Academy League rules
- 2.1 League will run for a 10-week period, with 30 scoring arrows shot each week
- **2.2** Some Leagues may run for additional weeks if Academy closures force League night to be canceled. Staff will communicate such changes to participants in a timely fashion
- **2.3** League will begin at 6:00PM on Wednesday evenings with open practice. Scoring will commence at 6:30PM
- 2.4 Participants may shoot their weekly scores at LAS outside of League night hours
- **2.5** An 80% handicap will be calculated and applied to each participant's scores
- **2.6** If a participant does not submit a score for a week by the final date specified by LAS staff, they will be awarded zero points for that week during final calculations for League placement
- **3.1** Lancaster Classic-style scoring will be used, and League participants must adhere to Lancaster Archery Classic rules unless otherwise specified in this document. For a full listing of these rules, please refer to the Lancaster Archery Classic website
- **3.2** All adult participants will shoot at 18m on a 40cm target face. Yeoman aged nine and younger have the option of shooting at 9m if they so choose. Yeoman must complete the League at whatever distance they shoot their first weekly score. Participants may choose to shoot either a 40cm single spot, or a 40cm triangle three spot
- **3.3** All participants will shoot in the same division, which is a universal division combining ages, genders, and bow types
- **3.4** Para archers are allowed an arrow agent, and/or a service animal. For full rules relating to allowable adaptive equipment, please see USA Archery's guidelines titled 'Policy for Wheelchairs, Adaptive Equipment, Agents and Service Animals'. Visually impaired archers will follow the guidelines set forth in World Archery's Rulebook, Section 21.12
- **4.1** Participants may sign up as a Team, or as individuals
- **4.2** Archers who do not sign up as a Team will be assigned one
- **4.3** Teams will be comprised of three or more archers, dependent on the size of that season's League

4.4 Teams will receive a final rank based on points earned during their weekly matchups. These matchups are randomly determined. Teams can earn a maximum of three points per week: one point to whichever Team in their matchup has a higher score in the first fifteen arrows shot, one point to whichever Team in their matchup has a higher score in the second fifteen arrows shot, and one point to whichever Team in their matchup has a higher overall score. A tie in any of these three circumstances will result in that point being evenly split between those two Teams

5.1 Participants must provide their own equipment to participate in League

Appendix A, Code of Conduct

This Code of Conduct applies to all participants and spectators for Lancaster Archery Academy's Leagues. No code of conduct can address every possible situation, and it should not take the place of good judgement and personal integrity. Lancaster Archery Supply expects that individuals who are in any way involved with our Leagues will hold themselves to the highest ethical standards as public representatives of our sport.

With this in mind, it is required that you will:

- Treat all archers fairly and with dignity and respect. They have the right to make
 mistakes and fail without fear. They have the right to be respected, encouraged, and
 supported appropriately by other athletes, parents, coaches, judges, spectators, event
 officials, and those in positions of authority
- Help create a competitive environment that is free from emotional, sexual, or physical abuse
- Not engage in unsportsmanlike conduct, which includes, but is not limited to, openly
 disputing or arguing with any decision by a judge or other official, using obscene or
 vulgar language that detracts from the ability of a competitor to attain peak
 performance, even if it is not directed at a particular person. You will not intentionally
 disrupt or distract a competitor in the course of competition, give intentionally
 inaccurate scoring of any round of shooting, taunt competitors, coaches, officials or
 others by means of baiting, ridiculing, physical violence, or threatening physical violence
- Refrain from the use of alcohol or other controlled substances while on the field of play, and from being under the influence of these aforementioned substances while on the field of play
- Know, understand and comply with all applicable federal, state and local laws and regulations
